



In our three-day meetings, if we spend half a day in prayer about the conclusions we expect to come to, we will have very different inspirations. We will come to quite different syntheses, ones we could never find in books nor arrive at through discussion.



If we are at the forefront of a new apostolate, we must be illuminated by the Holy Spirit. These are not the pious words of a novice master: what I am saying is 100% Ignatian! We must have a basic union of minds for this new apostolate which is being born.



Entering

Believe that you are 'looked at' or in the gaze of God; this helps to take the focus off ourselves. Ask for what you want. In Ignatian language it's known as 'asking for a grace'.
